



#### **Directory Update**



#### **Session News - September (approved)**

Clerks report: Discussion was had about per capita getting charged for any active member. Talked about how to decide how to mark people as inactive, will have a list at next meeting to go over and approve changing as inactive, can always request to be an active member at any time in the future. Baptism request was heard and scheduled. Home communion served 9 at Pennington Square. Reminder: Newsletter deadline is 20th of each month. Next session meeting Oct 9.

Pastor's report: Emory reported on various christian education groups and she has been doing with each group. Session met with Ann, an accountant, about an audit. Discussion was held about the work of cleaning out educational classrooms. Next Presbytery meeting is Sept 21. We do not have a representative to go to this meeting at this time.

Committees: Food at First resumed. TiLT received a \$1,000 with stipulation it needs to be a mission of the church. Had meeting to get volunteers for TiLT. Have enough for childcare in nursery for first four weeks. Labor Day brunch attendance better than expected (approx 190). Lots of positive comments. Looking forward to Memorial Day brunch. Stacey working with deacons on church directory. Dates for pics, postcards and emails sent. Deacons have donation jar at fellowship to help cover cost of food. Working on getting Care & Share tree up.

Building: Door on fridge was fixed. Looking into having exhaust fan installed, possibility of donated labor. Discussed more on AC, issues at hand, possible resolves with more discussion to happen in the future. Thank you to the Parkers for weeding and cleaning up landscaping. Thank you sent from session. Discussion of having landscaping done in the future. Request was made to add white board out side of office to address building needs and requests list.

Christian Ed: Sent 6 campers to Camp Wyoming this summer. Meeting scheduled with parents for Confirmation classes to resume, both grades will meet together, two years of classes with one teacher, Pastor Emory. Bibles needed ordered for 3rd grade class so presentation date was moved until order is received. Balloons release was concern. Other ideas suggested bubbles with helium. Balloons are available in biodegradable option and have always been donated each year at no cost to church. Decided that since they are biodegradable, we would use balloons again this year and announce to congregation. No change made.

Personnel committee: Jo Zirkelbach was recruited to help with committee. Curt will train her this first year and then hopes to be able to step down following that. Will welcome Mackenzie at church in September.

Stewardship: Nothing to report.

Corporate Trust: Handout updates on budget. Bill for copier was higher than normal due to lapse in discussion regarding costs with new secretary. Bill will be lower going forward. Talked about printer getting older but so far so good. Jo presented a couple ideas for buying vs leasing if we start having problems.

Mission Groups: will report quarterly going forward. TiLT, Montreat, Food at First.

Old Business: Audits of finances. Spoke with accountant who has done financial audits for other Presbyterian churches. Willing to speak at session meeting regarding options. Advised mission projects need to be under church umbrella, not separate. Will have her come to October meeting.

New Business: Electronic vs mailed newsletter, sending out mailer to whole congregation asking for new contact info and if they want it mailed USPS vs email. Printer: it is cheaper to get our own or keep. Jo presented options. Checking to see if black and white vs color. Decided office supplies will fall under corporate trust. Clean up day to be discussed in Oct meeting. Budget needs to be starting on for 2020. No recollection of nominating committee being created; will need to start the process at the next meeting. Discussion to be held in Oct meeting if we will continue to have LifeLine Screening here at our church; rumors it is a fraudulent organization.
