Mary and Martha

The story is really about Martha, isn't it? She is the one who is irritated. She is the one who's stressed. She's probably hot, too, from cooking over a fire. We find this story in the 10th chapter of Luke, and we get the sense that there's a lot more going on with Martha than the gospel tells us, lots of things stuffed down in her soul.

Counselors say that impatience is the best sign that our souls are overwhelmed with clutter. When we are at our ugliest, snapping at others to hurry up, underneath that short-tempered behavior, if we stop for a moment, we will realize that we are actually in pain, feeling tender, lashing out to protect ourselves. Martha is certainly impatient. My guess is that underneath her crabby words is

a bruised spirit.

But the answer is not to help her with the dishes, apparently. Maybe Jesus helped her with the dishes earlier. Maybe he helped her sweep the floors, and shake out the rugs. Maybe Jesus knew that after the dishes, for Martha, there's always another problem. After that problem, something else.

I like the way Jesus invites Martha to stop. Just stop. He's known her a long time, and he can see that it's hard for her to spare even a few minutes to sit and have her spiritual cup refilled.

Here in lowa, it's especially difficult during this time of year, I think, for all of us to pause. Summer is a super busy season. Lots of hard work. And lots of it is fun. But sometimes, we start snapping. Just like Martha, we start picking on others, feeling like we're the only one doing the work. It's all on our shoulders. The responsibilities are all on us

Jesus says, Maybe it's time for you to stop. Maybe it's time for you to take a break. Not later, when everything is finished and perfect. How about now? How about stop right now?

I love how he says that this quiet time will have lasting benefits. The blessings that come from this personal time-out will not be taken from us. He says this to Martha, which makes me smile.

Because even then - before the industrial and technological revolutions of the modern world - Jesus had to remind Martha that if she would 'unplug' herself from her stressors, her life would improve immediately. Why wait to let God care for you? Why wait until all the chores are done? Why not let God care for you right now?


When she isn't busy chasing her busy family, she enjoys cooking/baking, spending time outside with her family, reading and quilting. Stop in and say hello!
