Session News

August Session Meeting Summary:

Pastor Emory has been busy visiting the rehabilitation and assisted living centers in town to share worship and bible study with those unable to come to church. A youth group is on the radar and there is high hopes to get one going, soon! TiLT is coming together and will be meeting for the first time soon. She spent time at VBS this past month. Pastor Emory is the new church liaison for the Food Pantry.

A few of the attendees from Montreat visited with the session about their experience. It was an enjoyable, age appropriate experience that they thought was worthwhile of their time and the funds. They are looking forward to going again next year. More help and support will be required to pull it off, and the sooner the better so that the financial aspects can be worked out and planned for on a more comfortable timeframe. We are grateful for Karmen's amazing leadership, and we plan to have a larger planning team this year to share the hard work of putting this trip together. Thank you, Karmen!

Andy Smothers came and gave updates on what he has been doing in Bahrain area hospitals, schools and churches. There are 7 congregations in several languages. He ministers to the English-speaking congregation in the building that houses about 36 other congregations.

TiLT organizer Lindsay Ryan visited and talked to us on the parenting group that she has been working on. She has been marketing the group in the area and outlying areas. There is a private Facebook page for those parents in the group to share positive, supportive and constructive thoughts and ideas. They will meet in our church each Tuesday from 6 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. The meetings will be structured with the first 45 minutes allotted for a guest speaker, a break for snacks and refreshments and then restorative circles with a final coming together for the closing of the meeting. Fareway manager has agreed to donate new food products, church members have offered to make cookies and Jo Zirkelbach has offered to prepare lemonade. Silver Service Coordinator at the high school is looking into service hour volunteers to help with daycare. Meredith Parker and her mom are offering to help with kids. Looking for an adult volunteer to oversee the nursery. Still looking for help to organize food and nursery/child care.

Building: AC is a problem. Looking into and found out one air conditioner is broken and needs the compressor replaced. The second one has a Freon leak. Can refill but cannot say that it will not continue to leak. The quoted cost of repair/replace was just over \$6000. Discussion was held about looking into taking up a collection to help pay for them. Session had multiple questions. Going to get questions answered before making a decision.

Special offering/donations for TiLT to be put in some sort of container in front and back of church for the month of Sept and have Emory announce every Sunday.

Welcome for our new church secretary and her family will be Sep 15th at our worship service. Mackenzie and her family will be present.

Sunday School starts Sept 8th and working on the whole year planned in advance.


NURSING HOME MINISTRIES UPDATE
