What is Love?

I remember our Presbyterian minister, Bobby Wilkes, telling Bob and me that in the Christian tradition, love is a verb. I thought that maybe I wasn't understanding his point, but I pretended that I did. Bob and I were both extremely nervous, just about to get married, so we simply nodded our heads and moved on to the next topic.

Here in the month of February, love is a great topic. Love, we often say, is a feeling. It comes and goes. We fall in love. We fall out of love. We feel the love. We don't feel the love. So how can we promise to love someone on our wedding day? How can we promise to keep feeling the same way that we do today? Can we force ourselves to feel love?

In the New Testament, we are taught about a new kind of love. It is called agape love, pronounced a-Gah-pay, and yes, Bobby Wilkes was right, it is a verb. It means doing kind acts toward someone else. To love someone means simply to be nice to them, to smile at them, hug them, help them, and listen to them. It is not

feeling. It is an action.

So, yes, we can promise to love someone. As our feelings go up and down, ebb and flow, we can still smile at them, say hello, do kind things for them, speak kindly about them, and support them for years, even decades.

We can even take it a step further, as Jesus asked us, by loving our enemies. No, it does not mean that we should put on a fake smile and pretend to feel something when we don't. It means that we simply do acts of kindness toward them, regardless of our feelings. We offer a handshake. We offer eye contact. We give them a nod. We pick up the quarter they dropped.

This Valentine's month, let's continue to love one another as Jesus has loved us...not forcing ourselves to feel a certain way.....but by our actions - our smiles, kind words, friendly hugs and all that makes this life a beautiful, shared experience for all of us.

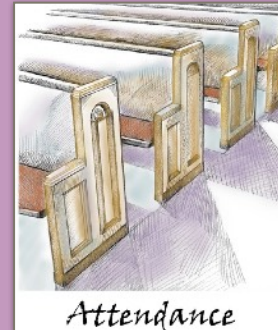

Love never dies" (1 Corinthians 13:4-8a, MSG).

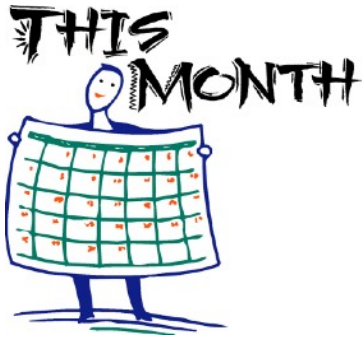


CAMP & CONFERENCE SOUP SUPPER
