## No Lone-Ranger Christians

World Communion Sunday, celebrated this year on October 2, reminds us there's no such thing as solitary Christianity. "As Christians we're called to belong, not just to believe," writes Rick Warren. "We are not meant to live lone-ranger lives; instead, we are to belong to Christ's family and be members of his body."

After all, Christian fellowship can't occur without fellow Christians. We can't learn the intricacies of the Bible and theology without preachers and teachers. We don't baptize ourselves. We don't take Holy Communion alone; in fact, the sacrament's very name refers to interaction with God and others.

The New Testament clearly states that one cannot be Christian all alone. We are members of Christ's body (Ephesians 5:30). We belong to the family of believers (Galatians 6:10). We are "a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people" (1 Peter 2:9, NRSV). So don't be a lone ranger or a stranger — to worship or to Holy Communion!

## Introducing...Pastor Gary Burnett ["GLB"]

A member of the Presbytery of East Iowa, Gary L Burnett is a retired certified interim ministry specialist. He was raised on a farm north of West Liberty, Iowa, before attending the University of Dubuque where he earned the Bachelor of Science, Master of Divinity, and Master of Sacred Theology degrees. Gary did further post-graduate work at McCormick Seminary. In 1970, Gary was ordained to a chaplain position at Kansas Neurological Institute, Topeka, Kansas, where he was also an affiliate with the Menninger Foundation. For five years in the 70's Gary was Director of Camp Wyoming's special needs camp.

After serving in three called/installed pastorates in Iowa and Illinois, Gary sensed a call to interim ministry. Beginning in 1984, he served nineteen interim pastorates in Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Ohio before retiring in 2008. Professional growth and development are very important to Gary as evidenced by:

- Completion of the Pastoral Care and Counseling Parish Program at Illinois Pastoral Institute in Bloomington, Illinois
- Advanced training in Family Systems and conflict management
- Certification as an Interim Specialist by the Presbyterian Church (USA)
- Faculty member for General Assembly sponsored interim ministry training

In six interim pastorates Gary served as after-pastor following misconduct by the previous pastor. He served interim positions in the Presbyterian Church (USA), United Church of Christ, and United Methodist Church. He and his spouse Anita have their retirement home in Riverside, Iowa. His on-going hobby is repairing and building homebuilt aircraft. In retirement, Monticello, First, is the seventh church where Gary has provided pastoral leadership. He served as moderator of the Presbytery Nominating Committee and member of the Presbytery Coordinating Commission for three years. He currently serves on the Congregational Development & Vitality Team.

Gary and Anita met at the University of Dubuque and were married in Northfield, IL, on August 7, 1965. Anita retired from being a Director of Christian Education in 2009. Once Gary began intentional interim ministry positions. they chose to make their home base near Anita's work in Iowa City and later the Bloomington/Normal area of Illinois. Gary commuted weekly, by-weekly and/or monthly, depending on the interim location. Gary's last interim before retirement was 39 months in the Cleveland, Ohio area. During that time Anita led education programs in two different PC(USA) churches.

In 1978, Gary and Anita adopted two half-siblings, Cindy (10) and Mary (5). Cindy graduated from Mt Vernon, IA, High School in 1985 and joined the Army. After Basic and AIT at Fort Jackson, SC, she went to Germany as a cook. It was there that she met with violence/murder at the hands of a fellow soldier. Mary graduated from West Branch High School in 1990 and held several jobs in the Iowa City area before moving

to South Carolina in 2013. She lives with and works for her birth-brother, Jimmy, in his repair/remodel business. Mary's son, Gage, has also relocated to South Carolina. Mary's and Jimmy's oldest sister, Connie, lived in Abingdon, Illinois at the time of her death in 2020. Her two children live in Galesburg and Abingdon with their families.

Gary and Anita are avid Hawkeyes with special interest in women's basketball since the Vivian Stringer days. They have more than a dozen "Bluder's Bunch" t-shirts.


