Pastor's (Pondekings)

Do you remember when you first learned to ride a bike? Some of you might have hopped right on and take off without much help. Most of us needed someone running along beside us, giving us instructions and encouragement as they tried to keep us upright. I thought about that as I ran up and down our sidewalk with my daughter many years ago. I was giving her those same bike lessons I'd received many years ago. I suddenly realized, maybe prompted by the Holy Spirit, that those bike lessons are also life lessons. They are concrete reminders of vastly important practices we must become skilled in order to move successfully through life.

The first lesson I had to give my daughter was: "Peddle... keep peddling." She sat on the seat with her eyes wide and apprehensive, unsure of the journey, with muscles tense and feet firmly locked in a non-peddling position. As we wend up and down the sidewalk, she began to make a turn or two, to get some momentum of her own, but then she would stop peddling, lose speed, and begin to waver.

We have to keep peddling in life. We have to keep ourselves going, maintaining our momentum. Fortunately there are times when we can coast, but most of the time we have to keep peddling. We have to keep peddling with our bodies, staying active, doing some type of exercise or work that promotes circulation and flexibility. WE have to keep peddling with our minds, stretching our thoughts, allowing new ideas and perspectives to come in and broaden our spiritually sensitive to new ways God is leading us, and having the courage to turn ourselves in new directions and to risk new ventures. Church members have to keep peddling with enthusiasm and dedication. They can't begin to think that the pastor is there to push them along. The church's ministry is a tandem bike, with everyone peddling as best he or she can.

Many years ago a famous wold renowned biker, Lance Armstrong, joined an elite company of 8 peddlers of the Tour de France to win the race at least three times. Lance learned how to keep peddling as a cancer survivor. Armstrong trains harder than anyone else in the sport. While others focus on the spring classics, Armstrong is riding the Alps and Pyrenees mountains. Lance has developed a strength of will which has earned him the title from the other peddlers of the Tour de France as "the boss."

and overzealous opinions," he writes. "Relationships have been ruptured, marriages dissolved and families torn apart due to a harsh response to hurts instead of a spirit of forgiveness and an attitude of reconciliation."

Christians may sometimes feel tempted to seek payback, but Jesus calls us to live differently. "We need to be reminded that we are to be a transformed people, not conformed to the attitudes and actions of this world (Romans 12:1-2)," says Weliever. "To be light in a world of darkness. And to be the pure, preserving salt in a society that's become corrupted and impure (Matthew 5:13-16)."
