PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Lesson 2: Learning to Ride a Bike

There are other lessons to be learned from learning to ride a bike other than to “keep peddling!” Again, my memory goes back a few years running alongside my daughter and pushing her until she peddled. I was holding her up, keeping her as erect as I could.

My second bike lesson to her was those familiar words, “Keep your balance! Keep your balance!” She instinctively made that task more difficult by suddenly throwing her weight to one side or the other when she thought she was going to fall over. She sensed she had to do something, but being a neophyte biker overcompensated, went to extremes, and thus lost the very balance she was trying to keep.

We all need to learn to keep our own balance in life’s journey. One way we do that is by keeping our head up and our eyes straightly focused on those things that really count. The writer of Proverbs, for example, encourages us to look for wisdom, to search for understanding and for knowledge of God. When we focus on something of great worth like that, then we have a better chance of keeping our emotional and spiritual balance. But, beckoning to us from the side of the road, or if we start turning around on our seat to look behind us at what we’ve missed, and what might have been, then we are bound to lose balance and crash.

We also keep our balance by not overreacting. Most of life is not a crisis, although it often feels like it is. When our child cries in the night, or our spouse expresses anger at us, our body begins to ache, we tend to respond with anxiety. These events alarm us, and we respond with alarm. What is more healthy and appropriate for us to do is to respond to these events as alerting signals, as signals alerting us to the fact that a particular response is needed to relieve a particular stress. When we respond to events as if they are alarming crises rather than as alerting signals, then we overreact. We bounce to the extremes, take drastic action, lose our balance, and often cause others to lose their balance too. “Keep your balance!”





Turn Your Platform into an Altar

Having a platform — or an avenue to communicate with lots of people — can be useful to share important messages, as long as we don't focus on our number of followers and pageviews. A platform also may tempt us to think we're the gift being offered; instead, I like to picture an altar. It's a place of offering and humility, where we give sacrificially through the reach God provides.

Use these reminders to view your platform as an altar:

- Strive to obey and trust God, who calls and strengthens you.
- Be a good steward of God's gifts and messages, caring for the people you're reaching.
- Avoid comparisons with others, looking to God alone for validation and approval.

Through Abraham's willingness to surrender his only son, the Old Testament patriarch modeled how a platform can become an altar. So did Jesus, the sinless Lamb of God, who became the ultimate sacrifice to pay our debt. As his New Testament followers, it's our privilege to invite others into this paradoxical kingdom, to give of ourselves as a living sacrifice.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS - JUNE 2023

- Aaron Orcutt, Suzy Gilkerson and Roger Benedict were present representing PNC. PNC has offered William Warhover the permanent pastoral position. PNC is at this meeting getting approval of benefit plan and salary. The Session approved the pastoral benefits and salary package. Candidate service set to July 9 to vote on accepting him as our called pastor. Drawing up a letter stating pastor Gary's last day/end of contract service July 31st and have clerk sign and give to Pastor Gary. PNC will have a meet & greet for incoming pastor on a Wed night. Pastor, if approved, will be starting Tue, Aug 1.
- Brent Vernon concert at our church evening of Sunday July 16th . Needs place to stay while in town – ask congregation (put in announcements and Facebook).
- Pastor did 2 home visits and 2 hospital visits this past month.
- Christian Ed Committee – Will do community VBS July 31st - Aug 4th, 9am-1pm. Will have a sign up passed in church for donations for meal and supplies. Voted to pay entire amount of our meal for VBS. First day of Sunday school Sep 10, will be when we ask kids to come talk about camp. Need to find 2 new SS teachers. Having a baked potato bar Wed, Oct 4th.
- Finance Committee – Dan handed out budget ledger for Jan-May along with payments and intake for May. Deductible for insurance going up from \$1,000 to \$2,500. Dan gave us a budget comparison with new pastor's salary in it. Dan showed us the list of what we are to check yearly for books by the book of order from presbytery.
- Building Committee – Landscaping has been paid for from memorial funds. Don changed all air exchange filters. Getting volunteers to help putting in screens in Sunday School wing and to take down next set to be repaired.
- Worship Committee – Stacey resigning at end of year from worship committee. Looking for a replacement.
- Memorial Committee– Approved to order red/white paraments with cross emblem, 3 pc set.
- Sat, Aug 26 for cleanup day. Stacey contact SS teachers and superintendent to go thru and organize their rooms. Stacey cleaned books out of library. More details as it gets closer.
- Community Back to School picnic Mon, Aug 21st, 5-7 pm, outdoor area by United Church. Looking for people to help set up and clean up and post flyers etc
- Voted to raise Sunday Worship Pianist to \$65 per Sunday. Sundays, July 2 & 23, we still need a pianist.
- Approved request for baptism - Isabel Corbin on July 16th .
