

One of the jobs we have is that of **greeter**. The greeter arrives 15-20 minutes before Sunday worship to greet people, 'Good morning! How are you?' Gives them a bulletin, and lets them know about things like following worship on the screens or where the bathroom or nursery is (if they are visiting). The greeter closes the doors to sanctuary at the beginning of worship.


After worship the greeter opens the doors to sanctuary during the last hymn. As people are leaving, the greeter checks the pews, puts up any hymnals or Bibles in the pew racks, tears our the signed attendances sheets and gives them to Dan Saunders.

This job is filled one Sunday at a time, so the greeter's commitment is just for the date you sign up on. It can be one person or a group of folks. 
Camp Wyoming Presentation!


