As Sunday School has started back up in September, we have had to be reminded of our Children and Youth Protection Policy. This is one of many policies that the church has adopted over the last couple years and guides us to insure our children and youth are safe when they are with us, and our volunteers are protected from false accusations of abuse. A Children and Youth Protection Policy is mandated by our denomination and by our insurance for good reasons, but most of all we want to keep children and youth, who are a gift from God, safe.

This policy says that those volunteering to work with our children and youth as Sunday School Teachers, Helpers, Youth Leaders or in the nursery need to be background checked. It also states that two adults need to present with children or youth in these activities. While making this work at First Presbyterian might be a challenge at times, there are a good group of adults that have agreed to be background checked. Some of those adults are teaching in Sunday School and some will be floating (being an extra pair of hands and eyes) when needed.

If you have question about this policy, please don't hesitate to talk with me or one of the Session Members. Thanks.

I am aware as we head into October that farmers will be fully engaged in the beauty and the hazards of the harvest. Thanks for the hard work you do! Enjoy the season and be safe!

## Thanks for Helping Out, ELDERS and DEACONS!

It takes all of us pitching in to make the church not only work, but work in the way it was intended.

Elders are elected by the congregation to serve the congregation through the gifts of leadership and spiritual leadership. They do this by making decisions about the direction of the church (like our mission and vision), making sure that we are provided opportunities for spiritual growth (like worship and Sunday Schools), and actively taking a part in some of the many committees that make sure things get done and are taken care of. (Like the building committee or Christian Education committee.)

Deacons are also elected by the congregation to service the congregation through acts of caring and compassion. The deacons make sure we stay in touch with each other by sending cards and notes to people. They arrange the fellowship time and organized the Care and Share Tree at Christmas time. The sometimes arrange for flowers to be taken to the home bound or nursing home members.



### **Appreciating Your Pastor**

Many people have complex relationships with their pastors because faith, church and God involve a mix of emotions. We have particular ideas about church practices, congregational priorities, the minister's use of time, money, authority and more.

But most pastors are deeply devoted to Christ and believe that God has called them to serve in a certain place. They have the best of intentions and work hard to share the good news of the gospel. So in honor of Pastor Appreciation Month in October, consider the following:

**God doesn't call the qualified; he qualifies the called.** Your pastor may need time to learn and develop certain skills. (Everyone does!) Bless pastors with your patience.

If a church wants a "better" pastor, it just needs to pray for the one it has. Pray often and caringly for your pastors, church leaders and their families. The role is challenging, so support them spiritually and ask God to reveal his love and grace to these special servants.




