

Pressed

Gethsemane, the name of the place where Jesus prayed before his betrayal, is an Aramaic word for "olive press." During Bible times, olives were pressed three times to remove all the valuable oil. Before being arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus felt the full pressing weight of our sins on his shoulders. Surrounded by olive trees, praying fervently while sweating drops of blood, the perfect Son of God asked his heavenly Father three times to remove the cup of suffering.

Instead of removing that trial, God used it to redeem and save humankind. Likewise, God uses our hardships to refine and strengthen our faith.

In *The Rock, the Road and the Rabbi*, TV host Kathie Lee Gifford and Messianic Rabbi Jason Sobel speculate that if Peter, along with James and John, hadn't fallen asleep in Gethsemane, he may have had the strength to not deny Jesus later that night.

"All of us must be vigilant to watch and pray so that we don't succumb to the temptation to deny the Lord when we go through the olive presses of life and feel like we are being crushed by our situation and circumstances," the authors write. "We must remember that it is the crushing that brings out the true inner value and worth of the olive."

"Bill! Nobody wants to talk about death!"

This was the response from a friend when I brought up the idea about having death as a Lenten theme... And it's true isn't it. If nothing else, in my 10 years as a hospice chaplain, I have learned that nobody wants to talk about death, even, a lot of times, when they are dying.

To talk about death is to acknowledge the fact that we are mortal, 'formed of the dust and to the dust we shall return'. To talk about death is to acknowledge that death will come for all, even us. To talk about death is to acknowledge not only death but the process of dying, the vulnerability, the uncertainty, and the grief of saying good bye.

Lent begins with its reminder on Ash Wednesday of our mortality, that we will one day return to the dust. Lent ends with the reminder of death as we recall the crucifixion of Jesus on Good Friday....

"Nobody wants to talk about death!" But the church spends forty days being reminded of death and remembering Jesus own death. Why?

Without death Easter has no meaning. Without death there is no reason to celebrate Easter's empty tomb. Without death, well, there is no death of death as Scott Cairns writes.

Put fear aside. Now that He has entered into death on our behalf, all who live no longer die as men once died. That ephemeral occasion has met its utter end. As seeds cast to the earth, we will not perish,

but like those seeds shall rise again—the shroud of death itself having been burst to tatters by love's immensity.






