Loving My "Enemies"

In polarized times, when people view huge concepts such as justice, government policy and care for neighbors differently, how do we follow Jesus' command to love our enemies? I prefer the word *opponents*, but our Lord's instructions still stand.

In the Bible, "love" doesn't mean liking someone; it means caring for them, treating them kindly. I find *The Message* paraphrase of Luke 6:27-36 helpful: "Let them bring out the best in you, not the worst," Jesus says about one's enemies. So, when I contact government leaders to express my opinions, I address them with respect, whether I agree with them or not. When I encounter a neighbor whose views oppose mine, I ask myself what I would want them to do for me, whether help with an errand or be friendly. Then, as The Message puts it, I "grab the initiative and do it for *them*."

And this, which might be the hardest: Amid tough times, Jesus says, "Respond with the supple moves of prayer." It's human nature to pray that God change our enemies' or opponents' minds. But it's more Christlike to pray for their health, their families and whatever *God* desires for them, not what *I* want. Can I do this? With God's help, yes.

Pastor's (Oondekings)

Things have been happening in April.

Next Generation Heating and Cooling have come and installed the mini-split units in the office and classrooms. We are waiting for the electricians to come to run the electric to the units. Once that is done, they will be up and running and that part of the building project will be done.

Rabe Hardware from Blairstown was here and have completed the installation of the solar panels and have done the electrical work to connect them to our electrical panels and Alliant's service. We are waiting for Alliant to come and run their test to ensure that the power the panels produce will interface with the electric grid. We are being told that this may take a month or two.

It will be summer before any of Phase I work on the sanctuary windows begins. We will know more as the contractor finishes projects already in process. Contractors and flooring options for the kitchen are being explored, so this part of the project is still in the works.

Dan has shared in the newsletter a summary of the Building Project Expenses and Capital Campaign income. What you will see is that we have commitments from the congregation of \$151,700 (as of 4/17). Of those commitments, we have already received \$68,450 (thank you, all).

We have spent \$43,700 (as of 4/17). I would encourage you to look at all the details in these reports.

We also have approximately \$108,630 in outstanding billing from Rabe and Next Generation for work done or yet to do (electrician to connect minisplits). Therefore, we anticipate having to make our first loan withdraw soon. The cash that has already been contributed will help us to keep the loan amount down. So, thanks again for your generosity in giving.

While all this is exciting and great, I am reminded that all these things are meant to help us be the church in this place, providing generous hospitality and space in the name of Jesus Christ to all who enter here.




Registration begins May 1

We want to remind parents that children are always welcomed in worship and that there are books, activity bulletins, and toys in the back of the sanctuary for your children to use during worship.

Nursery Guidelines Beginning in September

FPC values children in worship, but also recognizes the developmental challenges for children in our worship format.

The nursery is a place where children are welcomed as they learn how to be with others in worship. At the same time the nursery is a place to offer parents/ care givers respite so that they can engage in worship more fully.

When children begin second grade, FPC encourages children to remain throughout worship so they can learn about worship through their parents and the congregation and be a part of worship. The nursery will be available if a child or parent just needs an occasional break from time to time. The nursery remains available to those children that have special developmental needs. FPC will provide books and quiet activities located at the entry to help children with this transition.

The nursery is covered by our Child and Youth Protection Policy that includes background checking of those working with our children and youth and the two-adult rule. This policy is available in full by contacting the church office.

We encourage those members 18 years or older to take part in serving in the nursery ministry.


