What are you thankful for as you get ready to celebrate Thanksgiving?

Your health maybe? Or maybe your family? Or possibly a roof over your head and food on the table?

While the American tradition of thanksgiving comes from many places in our past, like that first thanksgiving when the New England Pilgrims shared a harvest meal with the native Wampanoag people, our modern celebration of Thanksgiving was born in the midst of our Civil War. In 1863, after years of fighting and horrendous losses of life and limb, President Lincoln signed a proclamation declaring, "the last Thursday of November next as a Day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens."

What are you thankful for?

A lot feels unsettled this year. As I write this, the government is shut down and the sides don't seem to be interested in talking to each other. Political violence is on an upward trend. People, even within families, have quit talking to each other over their political views. While the stock market has gone up, it feels for many their purchasing power has gone down. The Food Pantry Steering Committee is trying to figure out how to feed people if November SNAP benefits don't go out.

What are you thankful for?

As I write, I am aware that some of you have had challenges with your health or the health of a loved one, or that some of you are grieving the death of a loved one.

What are you thankful for?

Saint Paul, experienced a lot of difficulties and challenges as an apostle. In spite of these things, it seems that he was always encouraging people to be thankful and to give thanks to God. It seemed like a way for Paul and others to reframe their perspective on life, to be thankful even when things weren't the best, or when difficulties were piling up, or even when they had just been run over by life. Remembering the Saints

When Paul wrote to the church in Rome, he addressed his letter "To all God's beloved ... who are called to be saints" (Romans 1:7, NRSV). Paul regarded his fellow believers as people who have responded to the good news of Christ by choosing to follow and serve God.

The New Testament emphasizes that Christians are God's beloved – special people set apart to receive his grace and to be his witnesses. All people whose minds and hearts are devoted to God are "called to be saints."

About 700 years after the church began, leaders designated November 1 as All Saints' Day to honor people whose lives reflect Christ dwelling within them. Because of what God has done for us, all Christians can wear the label of saint.

MMA's Neighbors Helping Neighbors program provides financial assistance: for individuals and/or families with rent and utility bills, and stranded and transient travelers' assistance with food, gas, or shelter guided by our Monticello Police Officers.

Funds are also used to help pay gas for individuals with medical appointments in lowa City, Cedar Rapids, or Dubuque and reimburse mental health service for individuals unable afford co-payments or annual deductibles.

As part of Holiday on 1st, Above and Beyond Hospice sponsors a **Luminary Tribute** as a way to honor and remember loved ones. The event takes place on December 13th, from 4 to 7 pm. The luminaries will be placed, weather permitting, outside the library near the parking lot.

Anyone who would like is invited to decorate a bag in memory of a loved one and drop it off at the Above and Beyond office to be included in the luminary walk.
